

factsheet SURGICAL ABORTION OR MEDICAL ABORTION – WHAT IS THE DIFFERENCE?

	Surgical Abortion	Medical Abortion
Tests required	Blood test - beforeDating ultrasound	Blood test – before and afterDating ultrasound
Timing	 Usually performed after 6 weeks of pregnancy Becomes more expensive after 12 weeks of pregnancy 	 Must be performed before 9 weeks of pregnancy Usually performed after 6 weeks of pregnancy
Process	 Requires a light anaesthetic Surgical procedure in a day surgery clinic Procedure takes about 10 minutes Up to 4 hours recovery time in the day surgery clinic Sometimes light bleeding for up to 2 weeks or no bleeding Antibiotics are given Follow up appointment only if any complications or concerns 	 Medications taken in your own home or other safe place Cramping and heavy bleeding for the first few hours Light bleeding usually lasts about 2 weeks but can continue for up to 6 weeks Pain relief and anti-nausea tablets are recommended A follow up appointment is required to make sure the abortion is complete
Supports and recovery	 You will need a responsible adult to take you home from the day surgery clinic You are not able to drive after the procedure 	You will need to have a responsible adult with you for support for the first 24 hours after taking the medications
Side effects	 May feel tired due to the anesthetic May have bleeding and mild cramping usually lasts less than 2 weeks 	 Bleeding and cramping are expected Fever, chills, nausea and vomiting may also occur
Complications / risks	 Injury to lining of uterus or the cervix Infection Perforation of the uterus (a small hole) Reaction to anaesthetic 	Heavy bleedingInfectionIncomplete abortionContinuing pregnancy
	Complications for both surgical and medical abortion are rare	
Availability at FPNSW	 Available up to 12 weeks + 6 days of pregnancy at Chatswood Requires 2 appointments – assessment and procedure 	 Available up to 9 weeks of pregnancy at all FPNSW clinics Requires 3 appointments – assessment, prescription and follow up
